Dr Jeffrey L. Eaton is a graduate and faculty member of the Northwestern Psychoanalytic Society and Institute and a member of the International Psychoanalytic Association. He is a winner of the Frances Tustin Memorial Lecture Prize, and has been a Margaret Jarvie Memorial Lecturer at the University of Edinburgh and a Beeta Rank Memorial Lecturer at the Boston Psychoanalytic Society. In 2017 he was an International Guest Lecturer for The Australian Psychoanalytic

Society. He is author of <u>A Fruitful Harvest: Essays after Bion</u>, available on <u>Amazon.com</u>, as well as several chapters in edited collections. He is in private practice in Seattle, WA, USA and teaches, lectures, and consults widely. He has an ongoing interest in the work of Bion, Tustin, Winnicott, and Meltzer and is currently at work on a book that explores a version of a 'listening grid'.
